- Limited connections to and between growing port areas and other key gateway facilities
- Goods movement demand exceeds capacity and does not support projected economic growth
- Congestion and low speeds cause traffic to divert to local roads and compromises Canada's economic growth potential



Gateway Program

Gateway facilities such as ports, airports, and rail intermodal facilities now account for 75,000 jobs and \$10 billion in business output annually in Greater Vancouver alone.









